➤ **From the Library:** Andrew Greeley wrote: *The Persistence of Religion* and it was published in 1973 which is over fifty years ago but it is an interesting read.

Against the widespread and fashionable statements about the secular nature of the present religious situation, Dr Greeley argues that man's basic religious needs and basic religious functions have not changed very notably since the late Ice Age; what changes have occurred make religious questions more critical rather than less critical. He examines the sources of the conventional wisdom about our 'secular world' and sets out to show that its errors are rooted in inadequate assumptions about modern society; in subsequent chapters he looks at the connection between religion and basic human needs: sex, ethics, the community, the sacred. He is no dyed-in-the-wool reactionary: he believes that if religion has survived it is not because of the churches but despite them; but he refuses to take as normative the experiences of the most highly educated, leaving aside the rest of society.

Harvey Cox writes: 'A very readable, ambitious, persuasive and telling book. What it does is to provide a wider, more comprehensive and therefore more adequate and sensible picture into which to place a lot of undeniable facts that fashionable theories don't take into consideration. The book shows that a sociologist doesn't have to confine his reading to graphs and interviews, that good empirical field studies and good history and philosophy can be woven together'. [260 GRE]

As a deacon or a priest counselling needs to be done prayerfully. Nancy Kohner and Alix Henley have written *When a Baby dies: The Experience of Late Miscarriages, Still and Neonatal Death*. The two authors are from the Stillbirth and Neonatal Death Society (SANDS) and are experienced counsellors for the parents who have gone through this experience. About 66% of the book covers the emotional feelings about the death of their baby, whether in the uterus, or a live birth or a baby who died a few days later. They concluded in the majority of cases this is a lifetime of suffering. In fact, this is from the stories given years after the infant's death. This compassionate book offers insight and information for all parents whose babies have died, their families and friends, and professionals who care for them. The book contains valuable information about:

- Why a baby dies
- Hospital practices
- The process of grieving
- Sources of support
- The care parents need in future pregnancies.
