➤ **From the Library:** Donal Dorr has written *Integral Spirituality: Resources for Community, Justice, Peace and the Earth*. Beginning with a study of 'down to earth spirituality' which enables one to be 'rooted' or 'grounded', Dorr goes on to show how personal prayer plays a key role in spirituality; how to put people in touch with their own personal power and enables them to use this power with integrity. He examines ways in which liturgical prayer can be rescued from empty formalism and given new life. He then considers the different kinds of power and how an authentic spirituality allows power to be used to promote personal growth and how better to foster by putting their gifts at the service of the community. This in turn leads to a lengthy examination of the central role of justice in spirituality today. The final chapter entitled "where does God come in" is an exploration of how a relationship to God is linked to work for justice, peace, the care of the planet and the building of community. Dorr recounts the experiences of a Jesuit priest on his feelings towards a Hindu prayer.

Take Lord unto Thyself my sense of self
Let it vanish utterly.
Take Lord my life; live Thou my life through me
I live no longer Lord, but in me Thou livest.
Aye, between Thee and me God,
There is no longer room for "I" and "mine".

He disagreed with it in the morning, was part of a discussion group in the afternoon and changed his mind. He said, "Late that night I went for a walk alone under the stars. I found my heart almost bursting with happiness over what had happened".

Some clergy have impoverished parishes. A.C. Krass was one such person when he was a missionary in Northern Ghana and is entitled *Go ...and Make Disciples: Applied Theology*. Krass had to understand the area he was in and skills needed as communicator, counsellor and enablers of worship, witness and community service, best to be learned and taught in today's context of social change and unrest. In his review of this volume R Jeffery writes, "An excellent book admirable reading for anyone who wants to understand the Christian mission and to revitalize in it".
